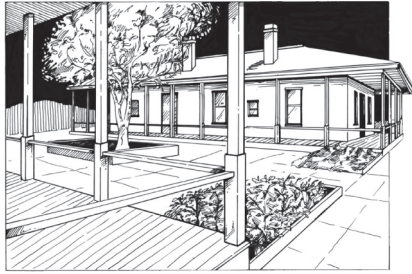

Established in 1987, the Udall Center for Studies in Public Policy sponsors policy-relevant, interdisciplinary research and forums that link scholarship and education with decision-making. The Center specializes in issues concerning: (1) environmental policy, primarily in the Southwest and U.S.-Mexico border region; (2) immigration policy of the United States; and (3) indigenous nations policy, with a focus on indigenous self-governance and economic development in the United States, Canada, and elsewhere.

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The Udall Center undertakes research and outreach on policy related to transboundary water management, global water initiatives, the role of public participation related to environmental institutions, and issues of significance to the Southwest and U.S.-Mexico border region. Researchers at the Center also collaborate on projects focused on the policy dimensions of climatic variability and change, including the role of climate information in decisionmaking related to land use and water resources. Members of the Center's staff have facilitated multistakeholder policy dialogues on contentious environmental issues.

IMMIGRATION POLICY

The Center's immigration initiative aims to illuminate the complexities of immigration in a global economy. By working at the intersection of academic research and public policy, the Center's goals are (1) to promote reasoned dialogue on immigration that avoids simplistic formulations and examines immigration to the United States in the context of current law and global political and economic realities and (2) to foster a deeper understanding of the tradeoffs involved in formulating sound and enforceable immigration policy.

INDIGENOUS NATIONS POLICY

Through its Native Nations Institute for Leadership, Management, and Policy (NNI), the Center focuses on policy analysis and research, executive education, and outreach related to tribal self-governance, economic development, natural resources and environmental issues, health, and aspects of relevant federal policy. The Center initiates research projects of its own and responds to requests or commissions from indigenous nations and other organizations.
